The American Mountain Guides Association (AMGA) Climbing Wall Instructor Certification is for professionals who teach climbing on indoor gyms and artificial climbing walls. This two-and-a-half-day course and exam aims to provide the participants with the technical skills to run an effective program at a climbing facility.

AMGA Certification: The American Mountain Guides Association (AMGA) certifies guides in three different disciplines: Rock, Alpine, and Ski. An individual can be certified at a variety of levels in each discipline. Once certified that individual has been deemed qualified by the AMGA to guide within that discipline within certain terrain guidelines (listed below).

### ASI GUIDE CERTIFICATIONS - Mountain Climbing Guides

The Alpine Skills Course (ASC) can be the first step in the AMGA’s Alpine Guide training and certification process. It is a 5-day course, designed for aspiring guides and instructors who have an alpine climbing background and interest in developing their guiding skills in this setting.

In the United States, up until 2010, there existed no formal training that was Nationally recognized for hiking & backpacking guides. Our curriculum, training and assessments have been approved by the National Park Service, Department of the Interior and International Mountain Leaders from European and South American countries.

Sightseeing Guide Exam and Exam Fee You must visit the DCA Licensing Center between 9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Monday through Friday to take the Sightseeing Guide Exam. The exam consists of 150 questions. You must answer a minimum of 97 questions correctly to pass. The \$50 exam fee is separate from the license fee and is nonrefundable.
